Please refer to the Request for Expression of Interest published on the Public Procurement Portal and AFD DG Market on 22 March 2024 regarding the above-mentioned subject.

2. Following queries received regarding the above-mentioned subject, bidders are requested to take note of the following replies:

Query No 1:

When you specify the possibility of bidding in a JV. What exactly do you mean by a JV: a specific company with two shareholders? Or is a partnership between two players enough to constitute what you call a JV?

Reply to Query No 1:

Joint Venture (JV) means an association with or without a legal personality distinct from that of its members of more than one Consultant where one member has the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the JV and where the members of the JV are jointly and severally liable to the Client for the performance of the Contract.

Query No 2:

in the objectives, we would like to better understand what you expect as results in (iii) "Capacity building of civil servants and stakeholders at large"? Your response will enable us to identify the best references to demonstrate our ability to meet your needs.

Reply to Query No 2:

By referring to the "Capacity building of public officers and stakeholders at large, on Climate Change, resilience of the tourism sector, its adaptation to chronic stress and extreme events, strategic change management", we are expecting the capacity building of all relevant local stakeholders involved with the tourism sector/its sub-sectors with focus on adaptation as well as mitigation, as appropriate. The stakeholders would include representatives from the public sector (namely for the strategic change management) and the relevant parastatal bodies; private sector;

academia; and NGOs (such as to better understand extreme events and needs to enhance the adaptive capacity).

The capacity building will also cover the process of setting long-term strategies for these sector and sub-sectors, covering both adaptation and mitigation, as appropriate, including on: the establishment of baselines, goals, indicators, modelling, long-term thinking, mainstreaming of climate change and monitoring and evaluation.
